Many leading environmental and security concerns now facing the international community may be traced to the frontiers, that is, the areas historically outside of national jurisdiction including the deep seabed, outer space, Antarctica, the atmosphere, and some argue, cyberspace. From climate change and cyber attacks to the associated problems of space weaponization and orbital debris, solutions to all of these issues have at their root governance failures in these frontiers, sometimes called the “global commons.” Environmental and security threats too are proliferating as a result of these regulatory regimes being in flux. This book stands on the shoulders of giants by comparing and contrasting the environmental and security issues facing these frontiers, analyzing how and why existing governance structures are often failing to mitigate global collective-action problems, and proposing a new way forward incorporating lessons from successful regimes as well as the interdisciplinary scholarship on polycentric governance.



**Scott Shackelford** serves on the faculty of Indiana University where he is Cybersecurity Program Chair and Director of the Ostrom Workshop Program on Cybersecurity and Internet Governance along with being a Research Fellow at the Harvard Kennedy School’s Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs, a Senior Fellow at the Center for Applied Cybersecurity Research, an Affiliated Scholar at the Stanford Center for Internet and Society, and a Term Member at the Council on Foreign Relations. Professor Shackelford has written more than 100 books, articles, and essays for diverse outlets ranging from the *University of Illinois Law Review* and the *American Business Law Journal* to the *Christian Science Monitor*, *Huffington Post*, and the *San Francisco Chronicle* ([website](#)).
