Ida Kubiszewski is an Associate Professor at School of Public Policy at The Australian National University. Dr. Kubiszewski is the author or co-author of over 50 scientific papers and co-authored or co-edited six books. She is a Fellow at the National Council for Science and the Environment and a Board Member at the Institut Veblen Pour Les Réformes Économiques (Veblen Institute for Economic Reforms) in Paris, France. She is the founding managing editor and current Associate Editor of magazine/journal hybrid called *Solutions* and a co-founder and former managing editor of the *Encyclopedia of Earth*, an electronic reference about the Earth, its natural environments, and their interaction with society.
