Civil Wars: The Challenges of Interstate Waterways

Interstate rivers, lakes, and aquifers provide almost 95 percent of the water in the United States. Unfortunately, the nation has yet to develop an effective means of resolving interstate conflicts over these waters, and interstate water wars are increasingly frequent. Climate change will further heighten interstate tensions in many areas of the country by raising the probability of serious droughts. This lecture will examine why interstate water disputes have proven so hard to resolve and ask how the nation might better address them in the future.
