





Solving common problems-in-general

The horror of the H-Index

- Perverse incentives?
- Strategies to publish more?
 - *"Slicing thin baloney"* convert what should have been 1 article into 10 articles, instead.
 - Favor short paper production cycles (e.g. with a short data collection period)
 - Favor incremental theory development over solving practical problems
 - Get grad students to buy into the publication myth, and have them accepting you as a co-author
- Strategies to get cited?
 - Co-author with highly-productive and highly-cited peers
 - Favor review articles over work based on primary data and original ideas
 - I-cite-you-you-cite-me; cite-your-friends *fests* (here's where gender & diversity issues in academia arise!)
 - Gravitate to the topics that have proven to result in a guaranteed high number of citations
